Instructions for authors

Focus and Scope

Journal of Rare Cardiovascular Diseases (JRCD) is an international, quarterly issued, peer-reviewed, open access, online journal that keeps cardiologists and non-cardiologists up-to-date with rare disorders of the heart and vessels.

The Journal publishes fine quality review articles, original, basic and clinical sciences research papers, either positive or negative, case reports and articles on public health issues in the field of rare cardiovascular diseases and orphan cardiovascular drugs.

Topics of interest include, but are not limited to the following areas:

- (1) rare diseases of systemic circulation
- (2) rare diseases of pulmonary circulation
- (3) rare diseases of the heart (cardiomyopathies)
- (4) rare congenital cardiovascular diseases
- (5) rare arrhythmias
- (6) cardiac tumors and cardiovascular diseases in malignancy
- (7) cardiovascular diseases in pregnancy
- (8) basic science

Journal of Rare Cardiovascular Diseases follows the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) Recommendations for the Conduct, Reporting, Editing and Publication of Scholarly Work in Medical Journals. JRCD respects publication ethics as set out by the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE).

Submission of a manuscript to the Journal of Rare Cardiovascular Diseases implies that all authors have read and agreed to its content and that the manuscript conforms to the journal's policies.

JRCD accepts submissions from all international regions.

The Journal will consider for publication articles written in British English.

Types of paper

The following types of papers will be considered for publication in JRCD:

Original articles: word limit 4000 words, 40 references, no more than 6 figures/tables

Review paper: word limit 5000 words, 50 references, no more than 5 figures/tables

Case Report: word limit 3500 words, 30 references, no more than 5 figures/tables.

Editorial: word limit 2000 words, 20 references

Report: word limit 2000 words, no more than 10 figures/tables.

The type of paper should be indicated on the title page

Manuscript submission

Submission of a manuscript implies: that the work described has not been published before; that it is not under consideration for publication anywhere else; that its publication has been approved by all co-authors, if any, as well as by the responsible authorities – tacitly or explicitly – at the institute where the work has been carried out. The publisher will not be held legally responsible should there be any claims for compensation.

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Authors wishing to include figures, tables, or text passages that have already been published elsewhere are required to obtain permission from the copyright owner(s) and to include evidence that such permission has been granted when submitting their papers. Any material received without such evidence will be assumed to originate from the authors.

Online Submission

All articles must be submitted using an electronic submission system at www.jrcd.eu.

Standards of Reporting

Journal of Rare Cardiovascular Diseases advocates complete and transparent reporting of biomedical and biological research. Authors are recommended to adhere to the EQUATOR Network when preparing their manuscript.

Title page

The title page should include:

Type of paper

The name(s) of the author(s)

A concise and informative title

The affiliation(s) and address(es) of the author(s)

The e-mail address, telephone and fax numbers of the corresponding author

Conflict of interest

Authors are responsible for disclosing all financial and personal relationships that might bias or be seen to bias their work. The ICMJE has developed a Form for Disclosure of Conflicts of Interest to facilitate and standardize authors' disclosures, which should be attached to the submission documents.

If there is no potential conflict of interest, please include on the title page a notice 'Conflict of interest: none declared'.

Abstract

Please provide an abstract of 150 to 250 words. The abstract should not contain any undefined abbreviations or unspecified references.

Keywords

Please provide 4 to 6 keywords which can be used for indexing purposes.

Text

Text Formatting

Manuscripts should be submitted in Word.

Use a normal, plain font (e.g., 12-point Times Roman) for text.

Use italics for emphasis.

Use the automatic page numbering function to number the pages.

Do not use field functions.
Use tab stops or other commands for indents, not the space bar.
Use the table function, not spreadsheets, to make tables.
Use the equation editor or MathType for equations.
Save your file in doc format. Do not submit docx files.

Headings

Please use no more than three levels of displayed headings.

Original article should consist of the following sections: Background, Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions, References

Case reports should include the following headings: Background, Case presentation, Review of literature, Patient management and follow-up, References

Abbreviations

Abbreviations should be defined at first mention and used consistently thereafter.

Footnotes

Footnotes can be used to give additional information, which may include the citation of a reference included in the reference list. They should not consist solely of a reference citation, and they should never include the bibliographic details of a reference. They should also not contain any figures or tables.

Footnotes to the text are numbered consecutively; those to tables should be indicated by superscript lower-case letters (or asterisks for significance values and other statistical data). Footnotes to the title or the authors of the article are not given reference symbols.

Acknowledgments

Acknowledgments of people, grants, funds, etc. should be placed in a separate section before the reference list. The names of funding organizations should be written in full.

Scientific style Please always use internationally accepted signs and symbols for units (SI units). Generic names of drugs are preferred; if trade names are used, the generic name should be given at first mention.

References

Reference citations in the text should be identified by numbers in square brackets [].

The list of references should only include works that are cited in the text and that have been published or accepted for publication. Personal communications and unpublished works should only be mentioned in the text. Do not use footnotes or endnotes as a substitute for a reference list. The entries in the list should be numbered consecutively. The example:

Nowacka M, Kopec G, Stepniewski J, et al. Nitric oxide vs Sildenafil for pulmonary artery reactivity testing in heart transplantation candidates. *J Rare Cardiovasc Dis* 2012; 1: 7–9.

Please, list the first three authors and add “et al”.

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All tables are to be numbered using Arabic numerals.

Tables should always be cited in text in consecutive numerical order.

For each table, please supply a table caption (title) explaining the components of the table.

Identify any previously published material by giving the original source in the form of a reference at the end of the table caption.

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Supply all figures electronically.

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All submissions to the Journal are initially reviewed by editor and section editors. At this stage manuscripts may be rejected without peer review, if they fail to meet submission requirements or are otherwise inappropriate. Some manuscripts may be returned to authors for revision and resubmission prior to peer review process.

Submissions, that are not rejected at the first stage, are sent for peer review by at least two appropriate, independent referees. A blinded peer review process is conducted, in which the reviewers' names are routinely withheld from the author unless a reviewer requests a preference for his or her identity to be revealed.

If modifications to the manuscript are requested during the editorial and peer review process, the corresponding author should send to the online submission system the revised manuscript under two separate files - one file containing the revised clean version and another containing both a letter with point-by-point responses to the reviewers' comments and the revised version with corrections highlighted.

Correction of proofs should be limited to typographical errors. Substantial changes in content (changes of title and authorship, new results and corrected values, changes in figures and tables) are subject to editorial review. Changes that do not conform to the journal's style are not accepted. Corrected proofs must be sent back within 3 working days to the online submission system.

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All research must have been carried out within an appropriate ethical framework.

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Authorship

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1. made substantial contributions to conception and design, or acquisition of data, or analysis and interpretation of data;
2. been involved in drafting the manuscript or revising it critically for important intellectual content;
3. given final approval of the version to be published. Each author should have participated sufficiently in the work to take public responsibility for appropriate portions of the content;
4. agreed to be accountable for all aspects of the work in ensuring that questions related to the accuracy or integrity of any part of the work are appropriately investigated and resolved.

All contributors who do not meet the criteria for authorship should be listed in an 'Acknowledgements' section.

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
